"KIDDY PORN" DRAWS ATTENTION

Just recently, a friend of mine described me as the distributor of "kiddy porn." I think it was a compliment in that she was surprised to see my middle-school audiences so attentive. Since 1978, I have presented wildlife lectures and because of this "kiddy porn", I believe I have made the presentations more effective. Let me explain.

The reason smoke-filled, sales conventions start out with the speaker telling a dirty joke is because it gets the attention of the audience. Although I often find this hard-core approach to be distasteful, it works. The same principle can be applied with children and, once again, it works. Gently, but not distastefully, I utilize key words that are borderline "dirty" in the minds of the children. Students are likely to remember all about "barf balls" (pellets of undigested hair and bones regurgitated by birds of prey), "shoot poop" (feces projected from a hawk or eagle so as not to contaminate the nest with bacteria), and "possum ooze" (fowl smelling discharge produced by opossum in conjunction with their death-feigning behavior.

If you haven't already, cautiously give some "kiddy porn" a try; but be warned! You may never lose your audience!
