

All stages listed below include youth and practitioner Co-research Fellows' Involvement

- **1.Clarifying:** Refining research questions, conceptual framework,
- **2.Finding:** Identifying studies, projects, sources for review
- 3.Describing: Mapping equity-focused work to inform synthesis
- 4.Synthesizing: Configuring findings to address research questions
- **5.Appraising:** Evaluating strengths & room for growth in prior & current work
- **6.Initiating Change:** Inspiring change in ISL equity and belonging
